Cindy is currently serving as ***Project Manager for Trillium Learning***, and actively working on the Global Language & Culture Project (GLCP) as an assistant to the Director and Project Manager.

Cindy has been a freelance Chinese editor and writer since 2001, working for multiple Chinese websites. Her professional accomplishments, specialized literary writing style and responsible work attitude quickly won clients' approval. She became ***chief editor and main writer*** of one of those websites later that year.

She has written in many themes and literary styles, including fiction, prose, poetry, movie literature scripts, editorials, commentaries, on-the-spot reports, current events reports, and interview transcriptions; her complete work amounts to several hundred thousand Chinese characters per year. All her articles have been published online under her three pen names; some have been translated into multiple languages.

As a chief editor, she composes and edits numerous online articles, weekly news reports, brochures, flyers, and other online materials through her daily work. Many of her works have been widely used in mainland China and other Chinese communities worldwide. She is also in charge of many Chinese publication works. She puts ***special effort on children's books***; one of the books is a bilingual version. These books are titled "Lucky Babies' Fairy Tale Collection" (Vol.1 and Vol. 2). The bilingual book is well received by Chinese and American children.

On management experience, Cindy ***coordinates a writing team***, which is composed of nine writers. She is responsible for the team's long-term operations. Through weekly TeamSpeak conferences, she delivers writing direction, outline topics, writing mentalities, and perspectives to the team. In the past five years, the writing team has provided volumes of online articles for the Internet, their articles being re-published by many other websites.

Cindy is in charge of ***redesign and maintenance of an online public library***. She has redesigned a new infrastructure for the library and made firsthand information and management more efficient. She structured a core team to manage forty-five members of the staff for daily collection work and library maintenance.

Cindy has *six years of teaching profession in Law School of Beijing University*. Her specialties include Chinese Law Theories History, Chinese Civil Law, and Legal Science Research and Teaching. She was considered the finest teacher in Chinese Law Theories History and she was the first to obtain the Lecturer title among young teachers. She was selected for a one-year specialized training course to reinforce professional knowledge and teaching skills. Cindy was also invited to many professional conferences and legal science teaching seminars in the district and national levels. She served as *a lawyer in the Beijing University Law firm* simultaneously and focused serving for Civil Lawsuits during her teaching years.

Cindy is *a co-founder and former teacher of the Bergen County Chinese School*. She was in charge of evaluating teachers and selecting textbooks to meet the school teaching standards. She also taught multi-grade Chinese classes in the School for two years, and obtained the Best Teacher Award from the School Board and Students & Guardians Association.

Cindy has *experience in the business domain*. She was in charge of customer service in UniAm Corporation for three years and she worked as an office manager in Minmetals USA. Both are international trading companies. To attempt a different working experience, she worked in Meilin Printing for a year, in charge of printing supply control.

Cindy received a Bachelor of Legal Science in the Law School of Beijing University. In addition, she also received over two years of intensive professional training on Chinese literature and language from the same university.

During her teaching years, in a Chinese First National Young Calligrapher Competition, Cindy won Second Prize over a thousand five hundred participants.
